CHOOSING A MAJOR

Deciding what to do with the rest of your life can be daunting. Think of this as a starting point.

In this list, explore the degree programs you can finish on our campus.

BACCALAUREATE (FOUR-YEAR) DEGREE PROGRAMS ASSOCIATE (TWO-YEAR) DEGREE PROGRAMS

* 3+1 PROGRAM - STAY AT GREATER ALLEGHENY 3 YEARS 2+2 PROGRAM - START AT GREATER ALLEGHENY AND FINISH AT ANOTHER CAMPUS.

BACCALAUREATE PROGRAMS

Biobehavioral Health (B.S.): is an interdisciplinary program where students study the fundamental factors that influence human health and disease, as well as the factors that contribute to health disparities among diverse groups of people.

Business (B.S.): is designed for students who wish to become flexible business professionals, equipped to adapt to the ever-changing workplace of the future. Students may select a concentration in accounting, or management & marketing.

Communications (B.A.): is designed to prepare students for a global society by extending the traditional communication cycle (TV, Radio, Newspaper) and public relations to the digital age.

Criminal Justice (B.A. or B.S.): focuses on the interrelated components of the criminal justice system, public and private sector enforcement and investigation, legal systems, correctional treatment, and community services.

Cybersecurity Analytics and Operations (B.S.): prepares students to meet industry demands to protect digital information from attacks through cyber defense strategies while applying different methods in computer crime, police and forensic processes, cyberterrorism, privacy issues, legal requirements for collecting evidence, and international standards for cybersecurity.

* **Energy Engineering (B.S.):** incorporates elements of fuel science with the addition of courses focused on renewable energy and electrochemical engineering as well as professional electives in business, finance, and management.

Information Technology (B.S.): is structured to provide students with the theoretical frameworks and skill sets necessary to compete and be productive in applying information technology to solve problems in a global context. Students will be prepared to pursue careers in information technology, solving business organizations problems with an emphasis on the systems processes, and business operations integration.

Letters, Arts & Sciences (B.A.): is designed for students interested in creating a program focused on research, critical thinking, theory application, and communications.

Project and Supply Chain Management (B.S.): concentrates on developing knowledge, skills, and abilities in both project and supply chain management, dynamic and important disciplines in modern corporations. Project management skills include the development of new projects, and coordinating procurement and project delivery systems. Supply chain management emphasizes the integration of manufacturing and service operations, logistics, purchasing, and distribution that enable organizations to develop value-creating supply chain networks.

Psychology (B.A. or B.S.): inspires students to focus on the scientific study of thought, behavior, and experience. The principles of psychology are relevant to almost all areas of human endeavor, and the career paths of psychology students reflect this wealth of possibilities.

Recreation, Park, and Tourism Management (B.S.): prepares students for supervisory and administrative positions with park systems, environmental centers, commercial recreation and tourism agencies, private voluntary agencies, schools and colleges, and other commercial, nonprofit, and public organizations that provide recreation and leisure services.

Social Work (BSW): prepares students to work in the private and public sectors to provide social services for diverse people and communities, through understanding the cultural, economic, environmental, and historical conditions individuals and groups face. Graduates of this program will be prepared to promote individual, family, and community well-being.

ASSOCIATE PROGRAMS

Business Administration: is designed for students who wish to work in areas such as Accounting, Marketing and Management, and have a broad understanding of today's business environment. Our faculty bring current issues into the classroom, giving the theory and the practical experience needed for students to seek advancement in a current job or establish a new career.

Criminal Justice: develops an understanding of the three branches of criminal justice – Courts, Law Enforcement, and Corrections. Students will also develop an understanding of how law, public policy, and behavioral science intersect in the criminal justice field. Graduates can pursue entry-level positions, or continue on to earn a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice.

Information Sciences and Technology: this program is designed to prepare you for immediate employment opportunities or career advancement after graduation. Students will study technical topics such as database, web, and multimedia systems, and work to develop collaborative skills essential in a team-based field.

3+1 Plan

Penn State Greater Allegheny is the first commonwealth campus to offer a 3+1 program with Energy Engineering.

2+2 Plan

Students can begin the first two years of study at Penn State Greater Allegheny for nearly all 275+ degree programs before moving to another campus to finish.
